Introduction

As a part of West Side Community House's (WSCH) efforts to be green, we have invested considerable time and energy in developing our website to electronically showcase our programs and services as well as to offer an opportunity to download information. This bare bones annual report is our effort to reduce paper waste and focus our resources where there will be the greatest return on investment. History and Background

West Side Community House (WSCH) was founded in 1890 as the Methodist Deaconess Home of Cleveland. WSCH has operated as a private, nonsectarian nonprofit 501(c)3 social service agency since 1964, owned and operated by a board of managers. We maintain a covenant relationship with United Methodist Women. We work to meet the needs of the community residents by providing an array of model programs and services for children, families and older adults. Services are open to all social, racial, ethnic and income groups but are targeted to those who are most vulnerable and at-risk. Our programs strengthen the family, provide opportunities to learn and grow, support independent living, encourage economic self-sufficiency, and renew the life spirit.

West Side Community House 2015 Statistics and Demographics

All services provided at West Side Community House are free to individuals who meet specific program and service requirements. More information is available at www.WSCHouse.org.

Family-to-Family – provides supportive services to foster and adoptive families, identifies families in crisis through community referrals and self identification and provides wraparound services to prevent the need for County involvement. Families are linked by professional social work staff to hundreds of services in the community. Family team meetings and foster/adoptive parent support groups are key elements of the success of this program.

In 2015 staff members held 10 collaborative meetings attended by 257 direct service staff members from community service providers and made 6,128 referrals for 1,228 families linking them with services in the community to help stabilize and connect them with the supports they need to become strong.

(In 2015 we served 766 families with 2,298 children under the age of 18. A majority of these families (82%) live below 200% of the Federal poverty level.)

Tapestry System of Care - serves system involved youth with mental health conditions and their families. Parent Advocates and Youth Advocates work intensively over a long period of time to help families reach their goals. They link them to resources within the community. Monthly support groups are held at the center. Informative speakers, childcare and a youth group are offered as well as dinner during the meetings. We held 15 parent support groups and 15 youth group meetings in 2015 attended by 122 people.

(In 2015 we served 181 families, with 543 children under the age of 18, and made 362 referrals to community service providers. A majority of these families also live below 200% of the Federal poverty level.)

Community Wrap Around School – West Side Community House is the lead agency for the United Way Wraparound School Project at H. Barbara Booker School. During 2014-2015, we provided services and engaged with 275 parents and 385 students. We established nine expanded learning time and after school programs designed to enrich the learning environment for students and their families. We held two FAST (Families and Schools Together) sessions attended by 33 parents. We actively engaged both Booker and non-Booker families in 18 community events. We partnered with 19 community organizations and nonprofits to bring additional programming to Booker School students and families.

Children Exposed to Violence Initiative/Defending Childhood – an effort to address the effects of violence on the families and youth in the Cudell/West Boulevard neighborhoods. Held four eight-week ACT (Adults and Children Together) parenting classes. ACT is an evidence-based program that makes parents aware of the affects of

violence on their children and teaches non-violent disciplinary alternatives. (In 2015 we served 62 adults in ACT.)

Boys Council conducts weekly support sessions for boys ages 13-18 that help them to maintain positive attitudes, make good decisions, and to be resilient after setbacks. (In 2015 we served 19 system-involved boys).

Wrap for Success (W4S) - empowers parents through the successful completion and comprehension of the ACT Course including W4S Warm Up and Graduation sessions, and attendance at monthly Family Night and First Fridays meetings where they participate in interactive workshops with other community parents that are responsive to the challenges and needs that they identify. Also, as appropriate, we make referrals both internally to our family and youth programs, and externally to community partners. (In 2015, 62 parents participated in 12 wrap sessions and 106 parents and children attended 12 Family Nights. Over 90% of participating parents are currently or were previously system involved.)

Youth Services - Sisterhood, for girls ages 10 - 18, prepares girls for womanhood and their life beyond. Five Learning Cycles conducted during the school year cover Self-Identity, Service Learning, Arts and Technology, Economic Literacy, and Health and Wellness with interactive workshops, field trips and presentations that stimulate and challenge young minds while they engage and retain their interest. In addition, there are opportunities for mentoring, tutoring, homework assistance and academic test preparation provided by college student tutors. Sisterhood meets after-school with several weekend events and trips. *Summer of Sisterhood* is an intensive summer arts camp for 8 weeks that culminates in a live performance and CD and/or DVD. Girls ages 10 – 18 work with professional artists to write their own original work. In 2015 Summer of Sisterhood performed before an audience of 350 people at the Cleveland State University's Main Classroom auditorium.

We conducted outreach sessions at ten area schools and a session at CSU's Girls Health Summit attended by 400 young women.

(In 2015, we served 1,650 girls through our programs, services and telephone information and referral. Of these girls, 96% live at or below 150% of the Federal poverty level with the remaining 4% at just above 200%.)

Senior Services – a full array of services and programs designed to help seniors remain living independently in the community. In 2015 we prepared and delivered 36,292 meals to homebound seniors in our heated catering truck and prepared and served 22,554 congregate meals in our senior center. We provided nutrition education to 462 seniors during 2015 through presentations and informational materials.

Over 19 different physical exercise activities were provided on site each week and 12 cognitive activities as part of our Healthy Bodies-Healthy Minds program which provides rewards and incentives to seniors for their participation. Classes included: A Matter of Balance, Art Expressions, Chair Volleyball, Dance Fitness, Line Dancing, Pool, Pump it Up, Song Slings, Tai Chi, Timeslips, Yoga, and Wii Bowling.

In addition, we helped seniors to maintain good health by providing opportunities for free health screens. We held onsite, an average of five health screenings each month which included blood pressure check, cholesterol, and blood sugar and bi-monthly visits by a podiatrist.

Staff provided 450 hours of supportive services meeting with seniors individually to link them with needed benefits and services in the community, assist with billing issues, schedule medical appointments, secure a valid photo ID, and other services as needed. In addition, our staff took nearly 800 phone calls and provided information and referral assistance.

We provided 14,817 one-way trips on accessible vans to and from the center, to grocery, discount and pharmacy stores and to recreational activities. We contracted with Contract Transport Services for the majority of these trips.

(In 2015 we served 1,417 seniors through on-site, homebound, and telephone information and referral services. Over half of the seniors live at or below the poverty level with an additional 36% at or below 200% of poverty. Of the remaining 10%, most live just above the 200% level.) Overall Agency Statistics

In 2015, West Side Community House served a total of 7,108 children, families and seniors through programs and services provided through three core service areas: Families, Seniors and Youth.

Of all the people served, 6,883, or 89% live at low-income to below the Federal poverty level. The vast majority of the remainder live at levels just above low-income.

Program participants came from the western half of Cuyahoga County with the majority of people coming from the following Cleveland Statistical Planning Areas (SPAs): Brooklyn-Centre, Clark-Fulton, Cudell, Detroit-Shoreway, Edgewater, Jefferson, Ohio City, Puritas-Longmead, Stockyards, Tremont, and West Boulevard.

West Side Community House Management Team

Executive Director, Dawn Kolograf, has been director since 1991. Dawn holds a BSW from Kent State University and an MEd from Cleveland State University. Under Dawn's leadership the agency doubled in size with the inclusion of family service programs. In 2006, after conducting a \$2.3 million capital campaign, Dawn successfully saw WSCH relocated to a new, fully-accessible building in the heart of the agency's core service area.

Family Services Director, Rachelle Milner, LISW, holds a BSW from Clark University and an MSSA degree from Case Western Reserve University. Rachelle manages both the Family-to-Family, Tapestry Systems of Care, Wrap for Success and Defending Childhood Initiative programs at West Side Community House which have grown to serve over 1,000 families in crisis each year. She joined the WSCH management team in 2003.

Senior Services Director, Yvette Medina, created a bi-lingual, Spanish component in the program. She began as a teen intern at WSCH in 1984 and has been a member of the senior staff since 1988. She worked her way up to become director in 2006. Under her leadership two senior sites were successfully merged into one and the *Community Aging Initiative* and *Healthy Bodies-Healthy Minds* program were developed.

Youth Services Director, Allison McClain, has a BA and MA in English from University of Toledo. Ali manages the *Sisterhood* and *Summer of Sisterhood* programs. She moonlights as an English professor at Chancellor University and also is a professional poet and musician. Under her leadership, the *Summer of Sisterhood* summer arts camp was developed resulting in two CDs and a DVD. Ali joined WSCH in 2010

Administrative Assistant, Gloria Perez, joined WSCH in 1998 after working with the Cleveland Community Building Initiative. Formerly an administrative specialist in the Army National Guard, she's the agency's go-to person and is bi-lingual/Spanish.
